The Early Education Apprenticeship (EEA) offers a NEW infant/toddler and preschool career pathway for aspiring early childhood educators who live or work in Bosque, Falls, Freestone, Hill, Limestone and McLennan counties.

Apprentices benefit from paid on-the-job-learning, wage increases, and earning a Child Development Associate (CDA), level 1 certificate from MCC, and a Department of Labor (DOL) certificate. Earned college credit hours can be applied toward child development associate's and bachelor's degrees at MCC and Tarleton State University through the MCC University Center.

Applications open Monday, February 12. The deadline to apply is Monday, April 22. Classes begin at MCC Monday, June 3.
