# Impact Means Preparing and Connecting Job Seekers with Hiring Employers

Over the course of 2023, Workforce Solutions helped 3,431 job seekers find promising employment opportunities by directly connecting them with over 400 employers at our hiring events. Our hiring events open doors and create pathways to success for job seekers like Christopher, who attended our Make Your Winning Move Hiring Fair and Suit Up Event.

Among the 28 workforce development boards in Texas, Workforce Solutions ranked third in the state in helping job seekers remain employed one year after receiving services. From providing professional attire and work readiness workshops to offering direct job referrals and access to training and thousands of job openings, we're committed to connecting job seekers with meaningful employment opportunities. Our services provide lasting benefits for job seekers and the region's economy.





# Impact Means Creating Career Pathways Through Apprenticeship Opportunities

Improving the skills of our workforce is vital to bridging the skills gap between employers and employees. This year, Workforce Solutions for the Heart of Texas played a significant role in fulfilling this need by establishing and promoting child care and skilled trades apprenticeship training programs.

The new Early Education Apprenticeship (EEA) program, created in partnership with McLennan Community College (MCC) and the Department of Labor, is the first registered apprenticeship of its kind in the Heart of Texas region. EEA establishes career pathways for early childhood educators and enables them to earn wages while gaining industry-recognized credentials and on-the-job mentoring. This year, 12 early childhood educators, are benefiting from the program. The Texas Association for the Education of Young Children covers the cost of tuition and books and provides substitute pay to child care directors so apprentices can spend time with mentors.

The Multi-Craft Core Curriculum (MC3) preapprenticeship training program is equally impressive, having trained and graduated 13 individuals who are now first-year apprentices in the skilled trades. This program is nationally recognized and approved by the North America's Building Trades Unions. It is offered in partnership with Workforce Solutions for the Heart of Texas, MCC, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local Union 72, and Plumbers and Pipefitters Local Union 529.

Workforce Solutions for the Heart of Texas is empowering the next generation and setting them up for success by providing youth with opportunities to participate in a variety of career exploration and paid work experiences.

This year, Workforce Solutions served 221 youth through our Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) program and through our Summer Earn and Learn (SEAL) program. In addition, we provided career exploration opportunities for 4,012 high school students through our Career Education Outreach program and our YES! Expo career exploration event. Our YES! High School Student Welding Internship program provided high school students with paid welding internships that allowed them to gain hands-on welding experience and enhance their classroom learning. And this past summer, 56 youth gained valuable paid summer work experience while earning \$63,293 in wages.

## Impact Means

### Empowering Families Through Quality Child Care

Continuously improving the quality of our child care programs ensures children are better equipped with the skills and knowledge they need to thrive and provides parents with the support they need to pursue their career, training, and educational goals. Child Care Services (CCS) works diligently with our child care partners to meet increasing quality standards, and this year, 89.7% of children enrolled in CCS were able to attend a Texas Rising Star (TRS) quality rated program.

The LENA Grow program is an innovative early literacy and school readiness program that helps teachers of infants and toddlers improve classroom quality and increase interactions. By implementing LENA Grow in four TRS quality rated programs, seven teachers and 50 infants and toddlers benefited from a 24% increase in conversations and an overall increase in quality. Surveys also showed an increase in teacher confidence, and all seven participating teachers successfully pursued LENA certification. This is a great testament to the effectiveness of the program and its ability to make a meaningful impact on children's lives.

The Ages and Stages Questionnaire is a developmental screening tool for parents and professionals to check a child's development. This year, **76 teachers and directors** learned to administer, score, and interpret the results. Steps for making a referral for detected developmental delays or disabilities was included in the training. Klaras Center Early Childhood Intervention was a key project partner.
